GAZA'S SILENT AGONY: DECODING THE CRISIS-



Is Gaza and Genocide synonymous? Let the history answer it.

We all must've heard of this never-ending turmoil between Israel and Palestine. Social platforms are filled with news, horrors, empathy, disdain all with a pinch of conspiracy theories on this situation. Is this prejudice against a minority? Equity? Protective measures? Or a **genocide**?

The answer is hidden in plain sight. Let's unveil it with some understanding of the history dated back to **1948**.

The sparks begin with the nationalist movements emerging in the Middle East. The conflict gained momentum in the aftermath of World War I, with the British Mandate in Palestine and the Balfour Declaration in 1917, expressing support for a **"national home for the Jewish people."**

Tensions heightened in the mid-20th century, leading to the 1947 UN partition plan, which proposed dividing Palestine into an Arab and Jewish state

The subsequent wars, including the Six-Day War in 1967 and the Yom Kippur War in 1973, further shaped the territorial boundaries and power dynamics in the region.

Efforts for peace, such as the Oslo Accords in the 1990s, faced challenges, and the situation remains an international concern.

This very historical backdrop sets the stage for what we know as a 'crime against humanity'

To date, over **28,566+** Palestinians have lost their lives, with a heartbreaking toll of **12,000+** children, **8,000+** women, and **7,000+** men. By statistics, more than **5.9 million** Palestinians have been forcibly displaced from their homeland along with the destruction of their society, culture, political rights, identity and much more.

Now read that again. Countless lives destroyed as greed for power and territory wreaks havoc among barbaric forces. The heart-wrenching cries of hungry children and the struggles of pregnant women facing inadequate facilities are all too clear. The silent fury in the eyes of grieving men who have lost their loved ones speaks volumes. Yet, amidst this suffering, blame is cast between people, while ultimately, it is not the leaders of a community who bear the strain of a genocide, but the very community itself.

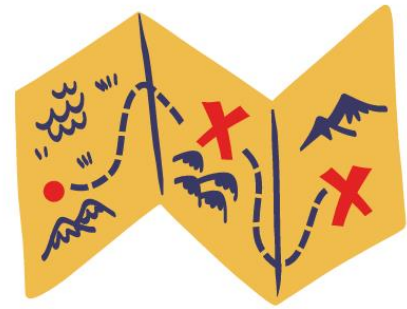
Despite the devastation of Palestine's integrity and rich culture it stands tall. After all, as declared by the greatest, truth inevitably triumphs over the veils of deception.

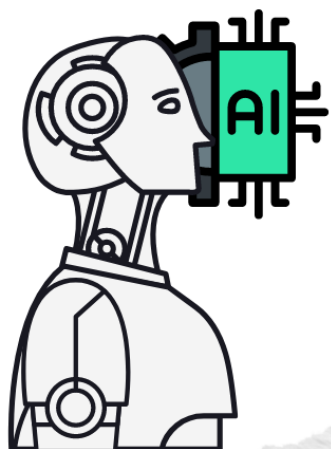

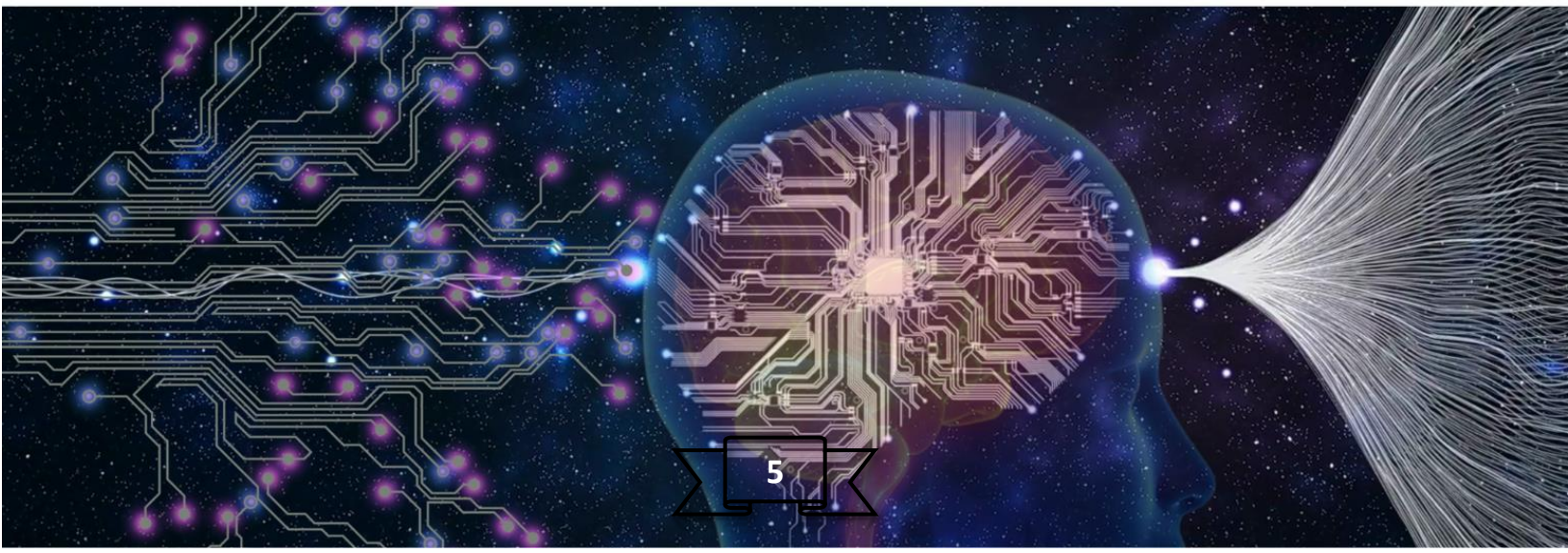

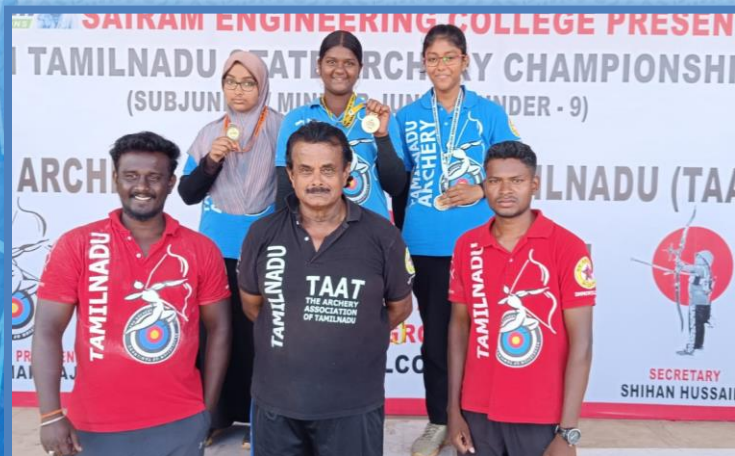

Indeed, a good tour always gives a good feeling for me. The school has arranged a tour for education of independency, how you can enjoy life by yourself and utilize Allah's blessings. We were venturing the freezing, rainy worlds called, Wayanad, Coorg and Mysore. Though our first station is at Kozhikode, we would leave to Wayanad after a while. I woke up at a fine day of 9th November 2023. The day of the trip has finally come. I was told that my mom, dad and eldest sister will come to the station. Then after a while we prayed Salat udh Duhr, and this is where the fun begins.

We were told to stay at the masjid so that they would provide lunch for us. The crowd kindling happiness and excitement added to my endeavour. We had tomato rice for lunch. Cool.... Then finally, I was in TEAM 3 led by Abdul Wakeel Sir with members Zubair, Ahmed ibn Shamshudeen, Ahab, Abdur Raheem, Hallis, Faaiz, Mafaaz, Zaahid, Armaan, Maajid and myself. We were a cool team... uh uh the others too hehe....

We went to our allotted buses and ahh.. the energy of everyone and the breeze flowing gently at my face and Wakeel sir giving instructions kindled the hype. As I crossed many familiar routes of Chennai, I was ready to say goodbye to my hometown, for 5 days at least. I felt the grandeur begin to ensue. It grew as I was nearing The Chennai Central station. It was a huge and wide red building presumably built by the British Colonialists.



I saw the giant India flag, erect and tall, hoisted in front of the station. As we were dragging our luggage into the station, I saw ourselves as an army of Unitians marching towards our destination clad with sports uniforms. Plus we had to wait for TWO HOURS to get our platform number, so I used the time to write a part of this journal. After a while, we headed to platform number 6 as per the info sent into us. We walked, or should I say marched to the waiting area. Later the great metal laden engine arrives with a lot of coaches. Ours was S8. We embarked upon with our luggage on our hands and sat on our respective seat numbers. It was MANGALORE EXPRESS. I, mom, dad and my sister we're talking eagerly through the train window. Armaan's father came to talk with Armaan and gave a mini speech to all of us, he's a sweet person honestly. I would miss my parents and sisters dearly but I was still ready for the adventure ahead, so I can narrate it all once I come back. Meanwhile at the upper berth, Ahmed and Hallis were playing chess. Ahmed was a champ Maa Shaa Allaah. At 4:20pm, I felt the engine attach to the coaches and a long honk it gave, and proceeded forward. I bid farewell to my parents and sister, and prepared for what lay ahead... To the renowned lands of Kerala and Karnataka.

After that we went back, oh boy, the way back was much harder. There was an entrance where the teachers asked permission to go through, they allowed us for 30 minutes only.

By then it was already dusk so we went back to Mount Avenue and prayed Maghrib-Isha. Then we had dinner from a barbecue joint. We had tandoori chicken, garlic sauce, some chapatti and veg kurma. Then we played basketball as they lit a bonfire at the corner. I scored one point.



We first went to the second largest dam in Asia, “Banasura dam”. We ascended it and Oh! It was sunny up there, we admired the sea for a while, shimmering like glitter and blissful blue. Some others had a zip line ride while we just strolled over the megastructure. Then we headed to Meenmutti falls. I am speechless regarding the description of the falls. As far as I could describe, we were at the base of the falls when we arrived, the water was clear, gliding over the rocks with laminar flow. On the way, there were lots of moss and gravel-laden rocks, I recall myself nearly slipping. There were even more of those as we went up the rocky part of the falls.

A sturdy rope was attached to the topmost part of the falls, we asked the management to go further and they allowed. Oh boy, there were more rocks with bits of gravel and the path was greatly inclined. We were largely depending on the rope. I was scar... uhh I mean thrilled and adventurous. It was really risky. When we reached the top, we were treated by the view of the source of the waterfalls. It was fresh and dazzling, we also had a view of the path we took from above. There were even more rocks, tall trees and a fresh breeze. We went down via another route downhill and reached our van. Our last sightseeing destination was a clear lake. The entrance gave a strange Japanese reveal with flowers hanging, we went in and relaxed and admired the lake for a while.



I recall Wakeel Sir telling us that we might see elephants in the forests of Coorg, Cool!!, this would be my first time seeing an elephant in real life, yes I haven't seen an elephant in real life. It was dark and cold outside, with spooky trees hanging, it felt like a ghost would jumpscare anytime. After a long journey, we reached a hotel and ate fried rice and chicken for dinner.

Then we headed to the river next to Dhubara forest. It was a little boring so we gave consent for kayaking. I looked up and the sky was a plethora of crows flying here and there and eagles shooing them around. I heard that eagles and crows are enemies but, that enmity looked somewhat beautiful. And those eagles were... **BALD EAGLES!?!?** I thought those were only found in America and its nearby countries.

At first, we were waiting in front of a huge pool with motors, then all of a sudden, everything turned dark. There were two shows with two display rounds each. Second of each had that popular “Jai Ho” song composed by ARR. Then the song played, with water spurting out in every direction within the pool from the fountain sprays, and light being scattered and refracted in every angle from the droplets (Hameed Sir taught this while this was going on). At certain intervals, purple rays of light shone in every direction, sometimes on trees where those rays depicted an image of the sun and the moon. At certain times when I wouldn't notice, raging flames shot up from torches arranged at the sides of the pool. We felt the heat as it roared out of those torches. It was so dramatic and catchy. The show continued for an hour or less with dancing fountains, roaring flames and drawing rays.

Hameed sir is a cheerful teacher, he calls his team members as “Elements” and the others by names of Indian sweets.... He says “elements” with reference to the periodic table in chemistry. We went back to van, and headed to a restaurant called “Hotel Plaza”, and ate peas pulao, Manchurian gravy and chicken 65 for dinner. Then we went to “Hotel Avaas” for staying tonight. Again, me, Maajid and Zubair was roommates. We checked in our luggage and were told to pray Maghrib-Isha in our rooms in Jam’ah.

We still had 4 more sightseeing destinations to go. We boarded the bus and headed to Mysore Zoo. There were birds and animals of different kinds. They were beautiful and interesting, some were colossal. The zoo was so good, maybe because it was established by the British in 1897. We entered its boxy entrance and after we entered, we saw different beautiful birds.

I saw some snakes moving, some just frozen and staring at us, I also saw one shed its skin. I also saw... behold, the biggest mammal on land, the African Elephant. It was boasting its colossal size, with its long pair of tusks and its elegant long trunk. This is the second time I’m seeing an elephant. Then we proceeded and saw one fat hippopotamus casually resting in a pond, then it was coming out. Maajid questioned about how could its ridiculously small legs support its fat body!! Ok enough fat-shaming that poor hippo.

We proceeded and saw three large flightless birds. The ostrich being one of the fastest land animals, the emu and the cassowary with its dinosaur like feature, no wonder birds are related to dinosaurs. Finally, as we neared the exit, behold!!! The tallest land mammal, the giraffe. Its long neck was displayed for all to see. I always believed that giraffes were too slender and weak but no!! Its legs looked muscular and majestic. My friend Salah was right!!! Then we finally exit the zoo and gathered at the van. The zoo was definitely an experience I would never forget. After Dhuhr-Asr Salah and lunch at Hotel Plaza, we headed to Mysore Palace. It was a huge, strong, polished and fortified building, I also saw certain foreigners saying, “Hmm... this place is good”. We had to remove our shoes before entering the building of red domes. The interior had a really antique fashion, it looked huge and majestic, held by pillars.

I saw cannons, statues, lamps with bulbs (back then it was probably candles), mini shops here and there, paintings, mirrors probably used by rulers or royal families, antique vessels?..., thrones, portraits and paintings of the rulers in the palace and most importantly, Ahab’s reaction... I mean the way he was amazed at the sight of interiors of the palace got me rolling. I felt a sense of history as I realised that I was walking upon the areas where rulers of the past had walked. I guess some parts of the palace were renovated. I also saw an ancient lift!!, I asked our social teacher Khaleelullah sir about the palace. He said that this palace existed much before the British colonised India!!! The rulers were told to rule as subordinates under the British reign. There were also times when they had the palace completely for themselves. After a photograph from a professional photographer, we headed back to the van.

We proceeded towards Srirangapatnam district of Mysore, with this, I got Tipu Sultan in my mind. He was a powerful Muslim ruler who fought a tiger once!! We were heading to his palace now. It looked very old, why it was not as lavish as Mysore Palace? We entered through its unique gateway and removed our shoes, we saw a small grey dome building. We went behind it and principal sir was giving us a speech about Tipu Sultan, the ruler was nigh invincible. He won every battle except one. After his death, all his family members were killed so as to cut off his lineage. All their graves were just near the small dome building. He also told us that Muslims had a powerful heritage in India. It was all just concealed. Inside the dome building was supposedly Tipu’s grave. The interiors were painted with a tiger theme, orange and black all over. After resting at the nearby park for a while, we all went back to the van and departed.



We finally headed to Chamundeshwari Temple as our last and final sightseeing destination. This giant golden temple is 3000 years old!!! It was named after the Chamundi Hills. They didn't let us in for we had to remove our shoes. The shoes arrangement system seemed worse than that of Mysore Palace and Tipu Sultan Memorial. So we headed back, but our experience did not go to waste, we went to see the view from up above and behold! A breath-taking landscape of most of the cultural capital had us lay our eyes upon with awe, a huge mist covered the landscape that gave a dramatic reveal. Behind the mist was Mysore Palace, a carnival and many more buildings and towns. I also saw a huge open field? A capsule-shaped one, some thought it was a training field for the military, I thought it was just an open park. We adored the breath-taking scenery for a while and finally went back to the van. The sun was already dipping into the horizon, this marked the end of our tour. We headed back to Hotel Plaza and by then it was dusk, so we prayed Maghrib-Isha.

Did I not mention that 9th graders were like little kids? Well, I wasn't wrong. Jaiwand successfully scared most of the 9th graders by tricking them into believing that there was a ghost hiding in the top floor. Everybody gazed at the stairs and there seemed to be someone lurking in the shadows. When they approached it, BOO!! It shouted and all of them raced downstairs, it was priceless. 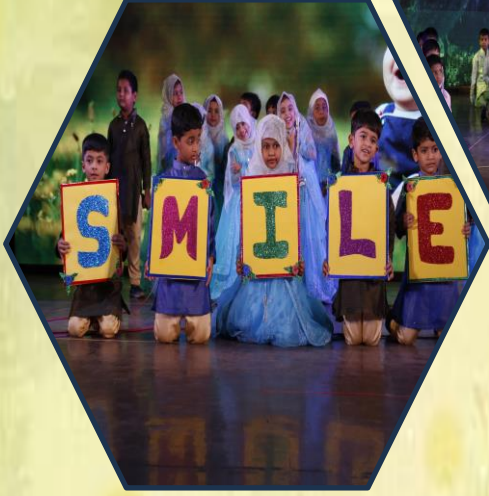


This grand event came to an end after three hours of enthusiastic performances by our beloved students. It made us realize the significance of compassion. This event will forever be in the hearts of Unitians.


